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in this postmodern age women preachers are finding their voice a distinctive way of proclamation this book looks at the metaphor of voice how women are moving to voice from silence and how individuals can make themselves heard by those who don t want to hear

this guide includes the primary and secondary works and summaries of plays of 15 prominent african american women playwrights including lorraine hansberry ntozake shange adrienne kennedy alice childress zora neale hurston georgia douglas johnson during the last 10 to 15 years critical consideration of contemporary as well as earlier black women playwrights has blossomed plays by black women are increasingly anthologized and two recently published anthologies devote themselves solely to black women dramatists in light of the growing interest in scholarship concerning african american women playwrights researchers and librarians need a bibliographical source that brings together the profiles interviews critical material and primary sources of black female playwrights this guide will provide a bibliographical essay reviewing the scholarship of black women playwrights as well as for each playwright a biography summaries of each play detailed annotations of secondary material and list of primary sources

theatre has long been considered a feminine interest for which women consistently purchase the majority of tickets while the shows they are seeing typically are written and brought to the stage by men furthermore the stories these productions tell are often about men and the complex leading roles in these shows are written for and performed by male actors despite this imbalance the feminist voice presses to be heard and has done so with more success than ever before in from aphra behn to fun home a cultural history of feminist theatre carey purcell traces the evolution of these important artists and productions

over several centuries after examining the roots of feminist theatre in early greek plays and looking at occasional works produced before the twentieth century purcell then identifies the key players and productions that have emerged over the last several decades this book covers the heyday of the second wave feminist movement which saw the growth of female centric theatre groups and highlights the work of playwrights such as caryl churchill pam gems and wendy wasserstein other prominent artists discussed here include playwrights paula vogel lynn and tony award winning directors garry hynes and julie taymor the volume also examines diversity in contemporary feminist theatre with discussions of such playwrights as young jean lee and lynn nottage and a look toward the future purcell explores the very nature of feminist theater does it qualify if a play is written by a woman or does it just need to feature strong female characters as well as how notable activist work for feminism has played a pivotal role in theatre an engaging survey of female artists on stage and behind the scenes from aphra behn to fun home will be of interest to theatregoers and anyone interested in the invaluable contributions of women in the performing arts

procter smith addresses liturgical fundamentals through her exploration of language verbal physical and visual god talk preaching and the role of the bible and the sacraments in addressing these theological matters procter smith suggests different ways of envisioning and practicing a woman oriented way of worship procter smith's love and care for the community and church is obvious she seeks a more inclusive and more relevant connection of liturgy to real life

the first ever collection of writing from the brixton black women's group one of the first and most important black radical organisations of the 1970s we came to britain in search of better opportunities or to get some of the wealth which had been misappropriated from the caribbean but what in reality did we find speak out brings together the writings of brixton black women's group for the first time in a landmark collection established in response to the lack of interest in women's issues experienced in male dominated black organisations the brixton black women's group's aim was to create a distinct space where women of african and asian descent could meet to focus on political social and cultural issues as they affected black women brixton black women's group published its own newsletter speak out which kept alive the debate about the relevance of feminism to black politics and provided a black women's perspective on immigration housing health and culture

macelle mahala's rich study of contemporary african american theater institutions reveals how they reflect and shape the histories and cultural realities of their cities arguing that the community in which a play is staged is as important to the work's meaning as the script or set mahala focuses on four cities arts ecologies to shed new light on the unique relationship between performance and place cleveland home to the oldest continuously operating black theater in the country pittsburgh birthplace of the legendary playwright august wilson san francisco a metropolis currently experiencing displacement of its black population and atlanta a city with forty years of progressive black leadership and reverse migration black theater city life looks at karamu house theatre the august wilson african american cultural center pittsburgh playwrights theatre company the lorraine hansberry theatre the african american shakespeare company the atlanta black theatre festival and kenny leon's true colors theatre company to demonstrate how each organization articulates the cultural specificities sociopolitical realities and histories of african americans these companies have faced challenges that mirror the larger racial and economic disparities in arts funding and social practice in america while their achievements exemplify such institutions vital role in enacting an artistic practice that reflects the cultural backgrounds of their local communities timely significant and deeply researched this book spotlights the artistic and civic import of black theaters in american cities

since the middle passage the intellectual and physical freedom of black women in the united states and the caribbean has been constrained yet black women writers artists choreographers and performers have contested pervasive political cultural and discursive silencing by drawing on the traditions and creative visions of multiple souths the southern united states and the caribbean as well as africa in the souths in her a phrase borrowed from ntozake shange nicole m morris johnson shows how key black women artists transformed the enclosing narrative frames imposed on them developing new forms of creative expression informed by the lived experiences and submerged histories of women across the africana southern world she analyzes the intertwined relationship between movement and writing in the works of zora neale hurston katherine dunham dianne mcintyre maryse condé and shange among others morris johnson demonstrates that although the central role of motion reinforced perceptions of primitivity that relegated black women and the south to a space outside modernity it was in fact crucial to their formal innovations for these writers and choreographers unexpected encounters with unfamiliar traditions and creative visions of multiple souths catalyzed formal experimentation and movements for liberation considering the violence routinely inflicted on black women alongside their artistic innovations this book reveals a transmuted south that is rich in techniques for weaving liberatory works illuminating black women s singular contributions to black modernity the souths in her offers new frames for understanding their embodied and textual creative expression

winner 2019 ron tyler award for best illustrated book sponsored by the texas state historical association tsha in this expansive and vigorous survey of the houston art scene of the 1970s and 1980s author pete gershon describes the city s emergence as a locus for the arts fueled by a boom in oil prices and by the arrival of several catalyzing figures including museum director james harithas and sculptor james surls harithas was a fierce champion for texan artists during his tenure as the director of the contemporary arts museum houston cam he put texas artists on the map but his renegade style proved too confrontational for

the museum's benefactors and after four years he wore out his welcome after Haritha's departure from the CAM. The chainsaw-wielding surfs established the Lawndale Annex as a largely unsupervised outpost of the University of Houston Art Department inside this dirty cavernous warehouse a new generation of Houston artists discovered their identities and began to flourish both the CAM and the Lawndale Annex set the scene for the emergence of small downtown artist-run spaces including Studio One, The Center for Art and Performance, Midtown Arts Center, and Diverseworks. Finally in 1985 the Museum of Fine Arts presented *Fresh Paint: The Houston School*, a nationally publicized survey of work by Houston painters. The exhibition capped an era of intensive artistic development and suggested that the city was about to be recognized along with New York and Los Angeles as a major center for art-making activity. Drawing upon primary archival materials, contemporary newspaper and magazine accounts, and over sixty interviews with significant figures, Gershon presents a narrative that preserves and interweaves the stories and insights of those who transformed the Houston art scene into the vibrant community that it is today.

El creixement dels moviments sociopolítics entre els anys seixanta i noranta als Estats Units i a Sud-àfrica va establir els fermes fonaments sobre els quals amb una força i ímpetu sense precedents es va forjar el teatre negre. D'aquests anys forma i contingut van sorgir a l'una del compromís polític i artístic adoptat per aquests artistes contra l'imperialisme, el colonialisme i el racisme occidentals per primera vegada en la història. El teatre negre dels Estats Units i de Sud-àfrica analitzava i valorava les arrels negres per a poder il·luminar la recerca d'un futur de llibertat. No obstant això, el context sociopolític i les circumstàncies específiques de cada país han generat igualment els trets distintius del teatre afro nord-americà i negre sud-africà incloses les diferències de gènere manifestos en ramificacions artístiques totalment heterogènies i úniques.

These diverse but unified descriptions of original ceremonies, liturgies, and rites offer suggestions for revitalizing traditional liturgical expressions in relation to women's experiences. The works collected here are drawn from the perspectives of Christian, Jewish, African American, Native American, and Hispanic women.

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
